

COL Andrea E. Crunkhorn was a distinguished military graduate from Marquette University. Her assignments have been a blend of clinical, leadership and administrative, including staff physical therapist at 97th General Hospital, Frankfurt, Germany; Chief, Physical Therapy, 2nd Infantry Division, Camp Casey, Korea; Army Medical Specialist Corps recruiter; Chief, Physical Therapy, Multinational Force and Observers, El Gorah, Egypt; Assistant Chief, Physical Therapy, Fitzsimons Army Medical Center; Chief, Outpatient Physical Therapy, Walter Reed Army Medical Center, Washington, D.C, and Executive Assistant to the Assistant Surgeon General for Force Projection at the Pentagon.

COL Crunkhorn served as Chief, Physical Therapy, Fort Benning, Georgia; Chief, Physical Therapy and Western Region Medical Command Consultant in Physical Therapy, Fort Lewis, Washington; and Combat Developer with the Division for Combat and Doctrine Development, Army Medical Department Center and School, Fort Sam Houston, Texas. She commanded U.S. Army Medical Activity Japan and Command Surgeon, U.S. Army Japan followed by command of Munson Army Health Center, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. COL Crunkhorn deployed with the 21st Combat Support Hospital in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation New Dawn then deployed as the Command Surgeon and Director, Medical Training Advisory Group, for the NATO Training Mission Afghanistan and Combined Security Transition Command Afghanistan. In 2007, COL Crunkhorn was additionally selected as the Physical Therapy Consultant to the Army Surgeon General; Chief, Physical Therapy Section; and Assistant Corps Chief, Army Medical Specialist Corps. COL Crunkhorn is currently Chief, Rehabilitation and Reintegration Division, Office of the Surgeon General.
