

Commander Webster was raised in Beaver, Pennsylvania and was commissioned as an Ensign on acceptance to Hahnemann University School of Medicine in 1993. Upon graduation in 1997, he reported to Naval Medical Center Portsmouth for Internship. In 1998 he was accepted to the Aerospace Medicine Residency and completed a Master's in Public Health from the Johns Hopkins School of Hygiene and Public Health. He completed the remainder of the Aerospace Medicine residency at the Naval Aerospace Medical Institute in Pensacola, Florida and was designated a Naval Flight Surgeon.



Upon completion of the residency in 2001, Commander Webster was assigned first as a squadron flight surgeon and later Group Surgeon for Marine Aircraft Group 39 at Camp Pendleton, California. During this tour he deployed for Operation Enduring Freedom/Iraqi Freedom and directly supported combat casualty evacuation missions.

In 2003 he transferred back to NAMI for duties as Department Head of Physical Examinations. In 2004 he was selected to serve as the Operational Medicine Assignments Officer (detailer), where he was responsible for over 700 billets of various types.

In 2005 Commander Webster reported to Naval Hospital Jacksonville for residency training in Family Medicine, serving as Chief Resident in 2006-7. He was then assigned to Naval Health Clinic Kings Bay, Georgia as Department Head of Community Health, performing work in both the Family Medicine and Occupational Medicine clinics. In 2009 he was transferred to the CVN 76 USS Ronald Reagan to serve as the Senior Medical Officer, where he successfully led the Medical department through a deployment, yard period, work-up cycle, Board of Inspection and Survey, and RIMPAC exercise with Pacific Rim coalition forces. His department earned the coveted "Blue M" twice for recognition of excellence in medical readiness. During this tour he was designated a Surface Warfare Medical Department Officer.

Upon completion of his Carrier tour, Commander Webster was selected to report to the Bureau of Medicine and Surgery where he currently serves as Director of Warrior Lifecycle Management and Program Manager for the Integrated Disability Evaluation System.

Commander Webster holds a Medical Doctorate Degree, board certification in Family Medicine and Aerospace Medicine, and is an Associate Fellow of the Aerospace Medical Association. His personal awards include the Meritorious Service Medal, Navy Commendation Medal with three gold stars, and Navy Achievement Medal with one gold star, as well as various unit and campaign awards. He and his wife Rachael have two daughters, Davan and Keeley.
